Plagiarism and use of AI

It is important that students & understand that there is strict policy regarding plagiarism:

Any act of plagiarism is prohibited and will result in a grade of 0.

A 2nd act of plagiarism in the same course will result in the student being expelled from the course without refund. Additional fees will apply if a student wishes to re-register for the course with a different assigned teacher.

Repeated acts of plagiarism could result in the student being expelled from school.

Plagiarism is defined as submitting work in which the student is NOT the original author such as copying from another source, using translation software and but not limited to the use of artificial intelligence.

The use of outside sources must be referenced and added in a bibliography.

Note that all work is processed through artificial intelligence and plagiarism checker software.
